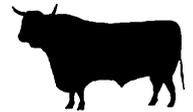

The Roman Villa site at Lower Woods is soon to be scheduled as an ancient monument by English Heritage and this year will probably be the last opportunity to carry out any excavation there.

Starting 28th June we hope to spend 3 weeks opening up & exploring a couple of trenches in the meadow behind Lower Woods Lodge.

There'll be an opportunity for us to show our results and any 'finds' on Saturday 17th July, 10.00am – 5.00pm, when we'll be holding an Open Day as part of the Festival of British Archaeology. SOUTH GLOUCESTER SENIOR CITIZENS FORUM

The South Gloucestershire Senior Citizens' Forum currently comprises over 4,400 men and women, all actively interested in having their concerns and opinions heard.

Launched in 1993 in Kingswood, the Forum widened significantly following the abolition of the County of Avon. As a result, free membership then became available to all residents of South Gloucestershire over the age of 50, irrespective of race, religion or politics. Whilst it remains resolutely non-party political, decisions taken by National and Local Government which affect senior citizens are the Forum's concern. Members' views on issues such as State pensions and benefits, health care, transport, crime prevention and so on are crucial to its work in campaigning on their behalf.

A newsletter is published four times a year containing current information and news, which allows members unable to attend Forum meetings to keep in touch. Meetings are held regularly throughout the area, at venues accessible to wheelchair users and hearing-impaired members. Community transport is organised whenever possible, from home to meeting place. Speakers on subjects of particular interest to members, often suggested by them, are invited. Question time is always lively!

The Management Committee also organises a number of Information Days annually. These run from 10am-4pm, involve four or five expert speakers on topical subjects, and include free lunch and refreshments. Their popularity is such that over-subscription is frequent.

South Gloucestershire Council recognises the Forum's importance in the community with an annual grant and the provision of an office in the Kingswood Civic Centre. Management Committee members maintain links with relevant Council policy-making by representation on some key committees, and similarly with Health and other Public services.

The Forum is affiliated to the National Pensioners' Convention, which has direct links with the Government of the day. A coachful of members pay to attend its Annual Conference at Blackpool in June.

RIDE AND STRIDE ON SEPTEMBER 11 – A DAY TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE FOR OUR CHURCH

Ride and Stride, run by the Gloucestershire Historic Churches Trust, is a great way to support this church and churches across the county when they most need help. It's an annual sponsored walk, bike or horse ride which happens on the second Saturday of September. That makes September 11th a date for the diary in 2010.

Walkers and riders turn out to follow their chosen route between churches which open for the day. Many of them serve refreshments as well as checking you in and providing a friendly welcome, directions and moral support. Whether you prefer a solitary expedition, or to go with family or a group of friends, you know that you're joining thousands of people countrywide to raise money for an important cause. As Ian Hislop said recently, 'In the old days the churches used to worry about saving us. Now we have to worry about saving them.'

What's in it for you, this church and the county's churches?

- a perfect motivation to get out, explore and enjoy yourself;
- the satisfaction of raising money and taking part in a nationwide initiative;
- 50% of the money you raise goes to the church of your choice;
- the chance to see inside some historic gems which cannot always be open for visits;
- the chance for the church you nominate to apply for a grant;

Even if you are unable to ride or stride, you can ask people to sponsor you to man your church or to carry out specific tasks while you are there.
