

We have recently installed two dishwashers, one in the kitchen and the other in the bar, with the help of a generous grant from the Parish Council. These machines give a very hot rinse so that the plates, etc, quickly dry by themselves. We are still learning how to use them efficiently; in due course we will put up instructions for their use.

We are concerned by the way local residents or their friends sometimes use the car park. Much of the time the car park is empty but problems arise now and again when someone has hired the hall for an event and people turn up only to find the car park already in use. So please don't assume that just because the car park is empty that the hall hasn't been hired out later in the day. People hiring the hall expect to have sole use of the car park as well. Shortly people hiring the hall will have available a notice that they can put out saying 'No parking - private function.' If in doubt, ask beforehand.

Horton Church Bells Project

On Friday 29th October, a small party from the congregation visited the workshops of bell engineers Matthew Higby and Company in Radstock to look at the bells and bell frame before the installation in the Church. This is planned to take place a little later this month.

Four out of the five original Horton bells have been supplemented by a replacement tenor bell cast in 1917 and an additional No.1 bell cast in 1873. Compared to the original Horton bells, these are relatively newcomers - the Horton bells date back to the 15th Century and were cast in Bristol. All the bells have been re-tuned at the Whitechapel Bell Foundry.



Details of Bell Frame

There was some surprise at the size of the new cast iron bell frame and on being confronted by the blue painted structure; some of the Horton party had trouble believing it would fit in the tower. The bell frame will be taken

apart, hoisted into the tower and re-assembled to sit on a new reinforced concrete ring beam in the belfry. New bell wheels made from oak, ash and elm have also been completed by a local craftsman.

The party were also treated to a display of bell-rope making using a hand winding device and a pattern block for the bell sallies which are wool sections where the hands grab the ropes. The rainbow colour of some sallies have been eschewed in favour of a more tasteful racing green which will also match the carpet in the Church. When the bells have been installed, a glass balustrade will be fixed across the open end of the new ringing stage and the base of the tower will be decorated.

Local History Group News

Our events programme this year has included some very enjoyable trips, notably a visit to the Groves' new home territory in Oxfordshire. Geoff & Jean organised a superb day for us, centring on the village of Swinbrook. We visited the small, simple 12thC church of St.Oswald, which has escaped defacement by subsequent reforms, and retained its original wall paintings. Its only access was through meadows along a broad valley. The later, larger church in the village proper revealed some quirky sculptures of its original benefactors, and some "gripping" choir stalls!

In October Gail & Neil kindly arranged a guided tour of the excellent restoration of Horton Hall. The building relates properly to its decoration and fittings once again, doing justice to the original craftsmanship and design.

Our visit to Westons Cider in Much Marcle, near Hereford, was in the spell of bright but icy weather in October. This is a family business that has grown, but stayed on its original site, its owners still living in the same house.



Hi-Tech Cider Making

We followed the process from the apple delivery tanks, through chopping and pressing, filtering and maturing. We finally entered the vast dimly-lit structure that houses the monstrous 60,000 gallon oak casks, Dolly, Squeak, Queen Elizabeth et al, in which the cider matures over 6-18 months according to the strength required. All varieties on offer were sampled before lunch, which some of us reached by a slightly meandering path....Another good day!

Some members of the history group have been researching how WW1 affected Little Sodbury and Horton, part of a local history project initiated by the Heritage Centre in Yate. It tells of the experiences of those who fought, some of whom returned, but some sadly not. Memorabilia, carefully stored over decades, has been loaned by their families, making more tangible their life at war. With the help of over 100 vintage photographs, it shows the impact the war effort had on both town and country; Sodbury used for mobilising troops, the High St lined with military vehicles; how women had a vital role, and how large houses like Horton Court became hospitals. Even if you are not Horton born and bred, there is plenty of interest here.

The exhibition runs at the Heritage Centre until December 2nd, with an evening of WW1 poetry, stories – (and wartime food!) on Monday 8th November at 7.30pm. If you do visit be sure to find the folder labelled 'Horton & Little Sodbury', for stories about 'our' boys and their families, and the exciting discovery of a past vicar of Horton's 'double life'.
