

These questions are in the minds of a group of local mums and grannies.


As a first step the 'Toddlers on Wednesdays' group are planning a meeting on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> July in the Village Hall and want you to join them if you've ideas and/or enthusiasm for the plan. And, we've found out already:-

1. Apparently another entry off the road would not be permitted. We'd need access through the edge of the car park. A path, protected from the cars, would be needed and also a hedged track around the field to the site.
2. A possible site for the play area is the corner of the field beyond the Pavilion.
3. This means when the Hall, field and car park are hired out for Brownies, or a wedding, there could still be an area available for village families to use.
4. Insurance for a modest play area could possibly be covered by the Hall's insurer, with an extra cost of about £100 a year
5. A small hillock, with a tunnel through it, sunken tractor tyres, a willow sapling screen and 'stepping stone' logs are all fairly cheap. A pair of swings would cost more.

Around 111,000 forms have been sent out across South Gloucestershire from the beginning of July, so make sure you look out for yours! The forms are hitting doorsteps earlier this year due to the new Police & Crime Commissioner Elections taking place on 15<sup>th</sup> November, so a prompt response is essential.

There are quick & easy ways to advise South Gloucestershire Council of NO CHANGES to your household details. Don't delay, use the automated service today and save your council money on printing reminder forms.

Using the two part security code on your Registration Form, you can confirm your details by:

If there are any CHANGES to your details, you will need to return your paper form by post using the freepost envelope provided. *Remember, if you're not on the register, you cannot vote. Getting personal credit could be difficult too -you may have problems getting a mortgage, credit card or even a mobile phone, so make sure you are registered.* If you have lost your form or need help, please call 01454 863030.

### FUNDS DONATED BY HORTON RESIDENTS TO FOUNDATION FOR CHILDREN

Last year the proceeds of the Christmas Card distribution and Carol Singing were donated to Foundation for Children, a charity established by a Horton resident to support disadvantaged children throughout the UK. In thanking the village for this donation, the Chair of Trustees promised to let everyone know how the money had been used.

A grant of £10,000 was awarded by Foundation for Children to Yate Opportunity Group Pre-School. The funding will be used in the main to enable two children with additional special needs to attend the group for five sessions per week of pre-school care and education with their own dedicated staff member. Without this funding, the children would not have been able to access the places, as their special needs mean that they require 1:1 care, which the local authority grant does not cover. Families who are able to access such placements report that the care they receive makes a significant difference to the well-being of the children and their parents.

The donation of over £200 from Horton village contributed toward this grant which benefitted the most disadvantaged children in the local community. The Trustees would like to take this opportunity to thank residents again for their generosity.
