






St James' Christmas Eve Service



What else

Horton & Little Sodbury Village Hall AGM

The Horton & Little Sodbury Village Hall AGM was held on the 21st October – thank you to all who came along. The key point came in the Treasurer's Report (paraphrased below)

(for the financial year ending April 2024) Income is down a lot. Fund raising is down on previous years despite some successful events. We're no longer putting on high earning events. Even though income from hall hire held up reasonably well, our income overall decreased considerably.


The reality is that currently we are running at a considerableloss, and have been for the past few years.

The cost of maintaining the hall is in the order of £14,000 pa, and then there are capital expenditures that go on top of that (like the new car park, and possibly a new boiler soon). Overall, income is down, with fewer people coming to events. (This is not just a Horton problem, this is happening nation wide). If this trend continues, then serious questions need to asked about the future of the hall.

If you have any ideas or suggestions as to (a) how we can reverse this trend and have fund raising events that people want to come to, or (b) how the hall can make money during non-hire times, then please contact the committee via chairman@halsvh.org.uk




How To Make Something From Nothing

The Badapple Theatre Company present 'Polaris, the Snow Bear', Thursday 2nd January 6.30pm. A tall tale for old and young alike.


'Grow and Show' Hawkesbury Horticultural talk Thu 23rd Jan. @ Hawkesbury VH
