


Friday night is Bingo Night at Horton Social Club on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> June. Eyes down at 8:30pm

(Ed – and don't worry – attendance doesn't mean that you are automatically co-opted onto the committee ②.)


### The Impossible Bomb – talk by Gareth Williams Sun 21st Sept @ Horton Village Hall

#### **Horton Spring Bull Run**






#### First Aid course

There was a First Aid course covering Emergency First Aid At Work that ran at Horton Village Hall on April 16th. The attendees received a certificate valid for 3 years. Katharine Lea-Wilson writes:

A group of 12 villagers assembled at the Village Hall just before Easter for a whole day of First Aid training. At the end of the day we took a test and were each awarded a certificate for Emergency First Aid at Work.

The trainer was excellent and kept us engaged, enthused and (sometimes literally) on our toes. We were also fuelled by tea and cake. One student wondered whether the trainer had a side-line as a stand-up comedian as her delivery was so good.

We learned all sorts of skills such as what a first aid kit should contain, how to assess the situation and the casualty when you are called to assist, how to do CPR, how to use a defib, how to place a patient in the recovery position, how to deal with wounds, choking, bleeding, bandaging, applying a sling and how to bandage someone's head. There was lots of opportunity to practise our skills on each other (in the case of bandaging, assessing a casualty and putting them in the recovery position).

We used resus dummies to practise CPR and realistic but non-functioning demo defibs to show us how those work. People had various reasons why they were on the course - several of us from the Village Hall Committee thought it might be useful for us to have some first aid training, whilst others needed basic first aid skills for their work. Someone else wanted to learn about first aid before becoming a grandfather for the first time.

The trainer was so good that one person who did the course has already booked her again to present the course to a group of horse owners.

Thanks go to all the people who make our Church so welcoming, what a team we have!..


### **Update from St Adeline's Church**

### **Update from Horton School**

Sadly this term we say goodbye to our headteacher Mrs Nicola Berry who is retiring after 17 years as our executive headteacher. Mrs Berry has been such an inspirational and effective headteacher of our two federated schools and has been particularly concerned to maintain the caring ethos of our village



school. Here the children thrive in a happy community and benefit from a stimulating curriculum, individual support where it is needed, a variety of after school clubs and Forest School which they particularly enjoy. This term there was a visit to the Hippodrome in Bristol where the children enjoyed a production of "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dream Coat"

At Easter the children led a service at the Church where they shared the Easter story with parents, grandparents and visitors in a thoughtful and moving way and with some inspiring singing.

Ofsted have also paid a visit and we eagerly await the written report due any day now. The Bishop's visitor also came to the school and in his letter, spoke in glowing terms about the school.

"I was taken around this small but beautiful School by the Headteacher, Nicola Berry. To say this school is good, is an understatement, it is beautiful and rich in its academic learning and the Christian message is everywhere to be seen all-around the school. All the children are integrated so well; it is a pleasure to see.

The children are very respectful to each other and to all the adults and there is a general feeling of calm and warmth. This doesn't mean that there isn't excitement, in fact there is. In each classroom there was a palpable excitement of learning which was fabulous to experience. Clearly the children love their school and it was beautiful to see. There is so much to say about this school which is so good, that picking out a few highlights has been very difficult.



## Old Sodbury news and events


Sam Newick writes :-

### **Defibrillator - now in Little Sodbury End**

Many thanks to Dr Phil Thornley of Cotswold Medicals in Little Sodbury End for installing a defib on the outside of the garage at Coverdale House. It's clearly visible from the road.

The defib is there for anyone to use in an emergency. As we saw recently, when the Village Hall defib saved a life, these devices are literally lifesavers.

Coverdale House is near the crossroads and the cattle grid in the centre of Little Sodbury End, just uphill from what was the Baptist Chapel. Coverdale House is opposite the postbox.

Even if you've never had any training on how to use a defib, the machine talks you through what you need to do and performs its own checks to assess if the patient's heart needs a shock to restart it.

Better still, there are plenty of courses around where you can learn and practise resuscitation skills.






We have free high speed wireless internet and a screen for you to project slides or other presentations. The hall seats up to about 100 people theatre style, and about 60 cabaret style.


