




The Impossible Bomb – talk by Gareth Williams Sun 21st Sept @ Horton Village Hall

There will be a service in the Church on Sunday 21st, with refreshments available afterwards.



A fund raising Craft Fair has been arranged and will take place in Horton Village Hall on Saturday, 1st November between 10.00am and 2.00pm.



<u>Show schedule:</u> This year's Show schedule, which contains a full list and descriptions of all exhibition classes, exhibiting rules, the annual awards, details for entering the carnival and entry forms, is available to buy from Hawkesbury Stores and Hawkesbury Post Office

<u>Showday information:</u> Gates open at 12,30pm. Cash and cards or pre-paid tickets, bought from Hawkesbury Shop or PO. On the Showground - the hog roast, beer tent, Pimms tent, 40 stalls including crafts, hot and cold food, gifts, Forest School activities for children and in the large Show marquee, exhibits of vegetables, flowers and fruit, crafts, home brewing, baking, photography and painting. There is a quiet space with refreshments available in the Village Hall.

Crowning of the Carnival Queen by the war memorial at 1.00pm then the carnival procession along High Street, led by the Nailsworth Silver Band. (High street is closed to traffic 12.30 - 1.30pm)

Entertainment in the Show arena: 'The Sheep Show' is a fun-filled presentation introducing 9 different breeds of sheep to visitors. Each takes their place on stage accompanied, by their very own theme tune. Nobby the Norfolk Horn is the star of the show. 


- Our book club meets monthly and are currently reading 'The Night Tiger' by Yangsze Choo.

What else

Defibrillator – update from Little Sodbury End

Phil Thornley writes:

Readers from the Little Sodbury End area will remember that about three months ago we installed a defibrillator on the front of our garage to help anyone locally who had a sudden cardiac event.

Well I never could have predicted how soon I might be needing one!

At the end of May, I was on my motorbike and took the M5 exit at Tewkesbury. On the roundabout I had a very serious collision with a car. I don't remember anything about it but a passing paramedic attended to me and said my Coma Scale was 3-4 (fifteen is normal and zero is dead!). The paramedic was local so he sent a passer-by to the local Porsche dealer to grab their public defibrillator.

Thankfully I didn't need it and I was helicoptered to the major trauma centre in Birmingham where I got fantastic treatment. I had a lot of injuries but I've been very blessed that my recuperation has been much quicker than people thought and I'm expected to make a full recovery.

It just shows that we don't know when or how we might come to need a defibrillator one day.

I believe all of us are now within reach of a defibrillator either in Horton or Little Sodbury End, so please do make yourself familiar with it and think about going on a course or at least watching some good YouTube videos about using an automated defibrillator. Do feel free to pop in if you want to have a closer look at this defibrillator.

Thank you so much to all our neighbours who have shown such care and kindness to us.




Outside we have a patio, a large car park and also a large playing field where you could have teambuilding events. We are within easy reach of Bristol, Bath, Yate,


